Level 1 Award in Health and Safety in the Workplace Half Day

Health and safety in the workplace are of paramount importance to employers and employees alike. Level 2 Award in Safe Moving and Handling

The Level 2 Award in Safe Moving and Handling (RQF) has been designed for learners starting or returning to work, who need specific training around moving and handling, or for refresher training.

It aims to ensure learners understand that moving and handling must be carried out the right way, and that they recognise its importance in contributing to a safe working environment.

Topics include:

- · Understanding the reasons for safe manual handling
- Understanding how manual handling risk assessments contribute to improving health and safety.
- Understanding the principles, types of equipment and testing requirements associated with manual handling safety.
- Applying safe manual handling principles



Safe Working at Height Half Day

The aim of this course is to assist learners in preparing to carry out Work at Heights, safely, within the workplace, preparing and using appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE), using equipment safely, following procedures and dealing with emergencies.

During this 3 hour qualification, learners will develop a basic awareness of working at height, focusing on key principles such as: safety considerations, legal obligations, hierarchy of control measures, reporting procedures for defective equipment and much more.

On successful completion of this course the learner will be able to:

- · Prepare to work at height safely
- · Enter and exit from height safely
- Prepare and use appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) in accordance with manufacturer's specification (including harnesses)
- Use equipment and tools safely and in accordance with manufacturer's instructions
- Follow procedures and work safely
- · Deal with emergencies
- Use appropriate behaviour for working at height
- · Use appropriate knowledge for working at height
- Apply relevant statuary and industry standards for working at height

Successful completion will prepare students to look carefully at their own work activities and contribute to the safer use of hazardous substances in cooperation with their managers and supervisors.
